IMPORTANCE OF THE CONFERENCE

The political and socioeconomic changes in our world caused by globalization have brought about global forms of communication, both affecting how knowledge is shared and shaped by multiple dimensions of global exchange. Such changes have also caused humanitarian emergencies, marginalisation and multiple crises. On-going wars and conflicts in different parts of the world have brought on many problems in affected societies. This is especially true in the Middle East, where violence and conflicts have increased significantly in recent years—for example, the crises effected by the war in Syria, the control of one-third of Iraq by the so-called ISIS with the resulting surge of IDPs and refugees into the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. As a result, affected nations and peoples face enormous challenges given the often horrific social conditions that have ensued, impacting whole societies, above all in terms of the plight of girls, women and children who have been particularly victimized by such difficult conditions.

Please note that papers submitted to the conference should not be submitted to any other conference or seminar, nor should have been previously published elsewhere in any language.

- The papers should be typewritten, with ample margins, including notes and bibliographical references.
- The papers can be submitted in Kurdish, Arabic or English.
- The fonts used to type the papers:
For Kurdish: Unikurd Goran
For Arabic: Simplified Arabic
For English: Times New Roman
- The papers should not exceed 25 pages (font size 12 for body and 10 for footnotes), including eventual maps, tables, graphs, figures and annexes
- The papers will be published in a special issue of Journal of Humanities.
- The conference will not be able to provide accommodation for the guests of the conference
- Local Researchers are required to pay (50000 IQD) for participating in the conference and foreign researchers are required to pay 50\$.
